Our school isn't the same without the students, so it is with pleasure that I welcome everyone back for the 2023-2024 school year. We had a fantastic start to the school year, and look forward to having a strong year.

The month of September is a good time to establish consistent habits. Students have done a great job of following our dress code policy; as a reminder, students are not allowed to wear hoodies, but they may bring a cardigan or nursing jacket, or may wear a long sleeved shirt underneath their scrub tops. The weather can be inconsistent during the start of fall, and classrooms have air conditioning, so students should come prepared for warm or cold temperatures. Additionally, as a reminder, students should not be on their phones or wearing airpods and headphones during class.

I'm happy to announce that we are making the move from Skyward to PowerSchool for grades and attendance. Students and families will be given information about how to access PowerSchool in the next few weeks as we finalize the transition. In addition to PowerSchool, we will be using Raptor to check in guests to our building. This is to help improve overall school safety. Visitors to our school will need to bring in their photo ID; visitors will not be allowed to enter the building if they do not have a photo ID. There will be more information provided soon.

At the start of the school year, we want to draw attention to student attendance. Our school is aiming to improve overall attendance across all grade levels; students who are chronically absent are at the highest risk of lower academic performance and delayed graduation dates. Eighteen absences is all that it takes to be considered chronically absent. Consistent presence at school is the key to academic success, and I want students and families to make it a goal to get to school every day. Our support team is able to assist families who may be struggling to get to school, so please reach out so that we can help you make a plan.

Nurse's Nook

Welcome Back to School RINI Students, Families and Staff! This is Nurse Erin here, so honored to be returning for my first full school year 2023-2024! A few things to remember! When you come to school this year, we want you to remember how much you will work, engage and participate throughout your whole day! Building relationships and connections with students and families is my passion, so I love seeing the students do the same! In the spirit of "cold season," and Nurse Erin's Wellness WIshes, I will remind you all of a few important tips. First my contact information: <u>eobrien@rinimc.org</u> or 401-343-0151

- Please be mindful of how your child is feeling on a daily basis. Meaning that if your child is not feeling well when they wake up in the morning and are not sure they are well enough to come to school, please call the school and keep your child at home sick.
- If their symptoms persist more than a day, the recommendation is to check in with your primary care doctor, test for COVID at home, and communicate with the Main Office 401-680-4900 and Nurse Erin so we may help with absences and academic support.
- It is not ok to send your child to school sick and ask them to check in with the Nurse. We are not providing COVID testing at school this year.
- If your child has a fever, a persistent cough, consistent nasal drainage, diarrhea or vomiting; we strongly encourage you to keep your child home, contact our Main Office, and consult with your doctor. Nurse Erin and the Health Team are available to help with any sort of care coordination with your doctors or providers. Don't have a doctor? Please let us know so we can help you find one. STAY HYDRATED!!

• Please have your child bring a water bottle to school each and every day. They can fill them up throughout the day with our filtered water stations. There are no cups dispensed for water in school. Each child must have their own water bottle.

NOURISH YOUR BODY!

• There is FREE breakfast and lunch each day in our cafeteria. If your child doesn't like the school options, we ask that you encourage them to eat a little something at home and/or pack their own food and snacks as there is refrigeration available for their lunch boxes. Please let us know if you're in a place of needing assistance with food, water bottles, school supplies, scrubs. We are here to help.

SLEEP WELL!

- Continue to practice healthy sleeping habits and good morning routines.
- Turn phones off at night, or place them away from your sleeping area WAKE UP READY FOR THE DAY!!
