At-a-Glance Special reminders

Chromebooks ONLY, Please: Students are only allowed to use their Chromebooks in school when they are online – NO EXCEPTIONS. The RINI network has specific safety measures in place to protect your students from online intrusions. This important safety net does not extend to other laptops that students may bring to school. As a result, students MAY NOT use their personal laptops and tablets in school to access online work. Students can take notes on tablets but will still need their school issued computer. Please remind your students to pack their school-approved Chromebooks and chargers each morning.

We are rapidly approaching the holiday season and with it, the last push of the semester. At this time, teachers are updating grades in PowerSchool, and our gradebooks are up to date. If you have any questions about your student's progress, please reach out to their classroom teachers. We recently held our Fall Semester Parent Teacher Conferences, however, if needed, we are more than happy to schedule a time for you to meet with and speak with your student's teachers.

Final exams for the Fall 2023 Semester will be held not long after we return to school in the new year: exam dates are January 24th, 25th, and 26th. As in the past, final exam exemptions will be at the discretion of the course instructor, so students should make sure they are communicating with their teachers to know what to expect at the end of the semester. More information about the final exam schedule will be provided as we approach the exam dates.

Students will be taking their Winter STAR Math tests on Wednesday, December 20th. This information provides teachers with information about student math levels, as well as how to better support students in developing the skills needed to succeed both in their classes as well as on standardized tests such as the SATs.

Additionally, Wednesday, December 20th, will be a half day for students. Student Council is running a Winter Spirit Week from December 18th - December 22nd, and will be holding bingo after school on Tuesday, December 19th, from 2:30 - 4PM. Bingo prizes include Dunkin gift cards, Target gift cards, and Flip-a-Zoo stuffed animals.

Nurse's Nook

This week, there are a few reminders that I want to put out to our school community. We no longer are testing for COVID-19 at school; if students are sick, families are responsible for obtaining testing for COVID, and they should not be sending sick students to our building. This is to help those students get better sooner, since it's hard to rest if you have to be up and about, and it's also to help keep the rest of the school community safe from illness.

Did you know that approximately 23,000 people in Rhode Island have diabetes and don't know it?

December is Diabetes Awareness Month. RINI will be hosting a Diabetes and Family Health Night on December 15th from 5PM - 7PM. At this event, we will also be hosting a free flu clinic, so if you have not already gotten your flu vaccine, please come by!

Many of the recommendations for preventing adult-onset, or type 2 diabetes, are similar to the recommendations for general good health. Prevention includes:

- Maintaining a healthy body weight
- Being physically active (yes, the stairs from the Lower Level to the 4th floor are good for you!)
- Eating a healthy diet with plenty of plants
- Eating healthy fats, like those from plants and fish, while avoiding too much fat from dairy and red meat
- Making healthy choices for yourself

Guidance and Advisory Updates

Dress Code Reminders: Students should be wearing cardigans, nursing jackets, and crewneck sweaters underneath their scrub tops. **Hoodies are not allowed with our uniforms**, and while students can wear coats to school, they are not allowed to wear their coats in class. 2023-2024 Rhode Island School-Located Flu Vaccination Clinics

RIDOH's Office of Immunization, in partnership with The Wellness Company, provide school-located flu vaccine clinics across Rhode Island. School-based flu clinics are an easy, convenient way for students, families, and community members to get vaccinated against the flu at no cost. The higher the number of people vaccinated, the lower the chances of a flu outbreak. Flu vaccination is critical this season to reduce the burden of other respiratory illnesses and hospital admissions on the healthcare system.

Keep students healthy and in school by helping to prevent the spread of flu. Encourage everyone to get a flu vaccine. Run your KIDSNET report to see which of your patients/clients need a flu shot. All are welcome!

There are 220 flu clinics scheduled at public and private schools throughout the state. Most evening clinics are open to community members age three or older. Some school districts will host clinics at each individual school. Other districts choose larger sites to host clinics where all community members can attend. Daytime clinics are available in high schools. These clinics are typically scheduled during the school day to increase participation, and they are limited to students, staff, and faculty.
