Since the [Fourth of July](#) lands on a Sunday this year, that means there's an extra day to celebrate with the family on Monday! Here's a look at just some of the fun things going on in and around Providence this Fourth of July weekend.

[Warwick Independence Day Fireworks](#): Catch a wonderful [seaside fireworks display from Warwick's Oakland Beach](#) on July 3. The show will begin at 9 p.m. and will last for about 40 minutes. If you're headed to the seawall, expect some traffic delays. Another great viewing option is City Park, offering unobstructed views along the shoreline.

Newport Fourth of July Fireworks Display Take the [Providence–Newport Ferry](#) down to Newport to celebrate their Independence Day festivities. The fireworks display will be held on July 4 after dark, at around 9:15 p.m., with the best view being from Newport Harbor. Popular viewing locations include Perrotti Park, King Park and Queen Anne Square.

[Pawtucket Presents Fireworks & Food Trucks](#) On Saturday, July 3, grab a bite from [more than a dozen food trucks in Pawtucket at Joseph Jenks Junior High](#). There will be live music and family fun beginning at 6 p.m., and fireworks will be launched from McCoy Stadium at 9 p.m. The event is free — you just pay for what you eat and drink.

7. Which of your parents will be signing them?
8. Parent phone number.
